Our membership comprises manufacturers, dealers, distributors, designers, consultants, contractors, and end users, all united in their commitment to advancing irrigation practices and water management across the province.

For over 45 years, IIABC has played a pivotal role in shaping the future of irrigation in British Columbia, fostering sustainable practices and promoting effective water management for the benefit of all stakeholders. Through our initiatives in education, certification, and industry collaboration, we strive to enhance the knowledge and skills of our members, ensuring they are equipped to meet the challenges of an evolving industry.

Land Acknowledgement

The Irrigation Industry Association of British Columbia (IIABC) acknowledges that our office in Abbotsford is located on the traditional, ancestral, and unceded territory of the Stó:lō People, particularly the Sumas and Matsqui First Nations. We recognize and deeply respect the enduring connection of Indigenous Peoples to the land, waters, and resources that continue to sustain their communities. As an organization committed to promoting responsible irrigation and water management, we acknowledge the stewardship and traditional ecological knowledge of Indigenous communities across British Columbia.

For our online education and province-wide initiatives, we also recognize and respect the diverse Indigenous territories where our members, students, and industry partners live and work.



IIABC History

The Irrigation Industry Association of British Columbia (IIABC) was conceived in February 1978 during a three-day seminar held in Vernon, BC. The event brought together irrigation dealers, distributors, manufacturers, and other industry stakeholders. Recognizing the need for a formal association to support the growing irrigation industry in the province, an ad hoc committee was formed, representing a cross-section of the industry. This committee was tasked with establishing a structured organization to address the shared interests and challenges faced by industry participants.

On February 9, 1979, the IIABC was officially founded with an elected board of directors, a constitution, and by-laws. Among the founding members were notable individuals such as Colin MacKay of Normac Equipment Sales Ltd., Ding (Albert) Hafer of C.P.I. Equipment Ltd., John Naka of Valley Water Works, and the late Reg Miller, Director of Specialist Services at the B.C. Ministry of Agriculture. Colin MacKay was elected as the first president of the association, leading the organization in uniting all facets of the industry under a common set of goals and objectives.

In its early years, the IIABC successfully lobbied the provincial government for changes to the Agriculture Land Development Act (ALDA) Loan program, helping B.C. farmers access better loan terms for irrigation and drainage costs while encouraging the use of local dealers. As the association grew, it continued to champion the interests of the industry through the development of standards and guidelines for irrigation systems.

In 1986, the IIABC published the "General Specifications for Turf Irrigation Systems," and later revised these standards in 1997 with the publication of the "Standards for Landscape Irrigation Systems," providing valuable guidance to industry professionals. In 1988, the IIABC launched its Certification Program, setting design standards for irrigation systems and promoting certified individuals who demonstrated competence in various categories, including turf irrigation, agriculture, and landscape drip systems.

The IIABC has remained committed to improving the professionalism and sustainability of the irrigation industry. Through education, certification, and advocacy, the association has established itself as a leader in promoting efficient water management and conservation practices. Today, the IIABC continues to serve its members and the broader industry with the same dedication and vision that inspired its founding members over four decades ago.


